Beth was born with Cerebral Palsy, in Lubbock, Texas on March 19, 1954. She grew up in Little Rock, Arkansas with her family until the death of her father, Henry M. de Noble at which time she moved to Santa Barbara, CA. After graduating from Dos Pueblos High School, she took classes at Santa Barbara City College. She was a life-long learner, who amazed us all with her prodigious memory and ability to tackle modern technology. She has lived in Carpinteria independently since 1996.

Despite being fiercely independent, she valued her family, friendships, and her "chosen family" above all else. Beth and Phil Womble recently celebrated the 40th anniversary of their Life Partnership. They had an inspirational bond forged in mutual respect and love that "always protects, always trusts, always

hopes and always perseveres" 1 Corinthians 13:7

In addition to her father, she is preceded in death by her mother, Helen K. de Noble and nephew Phillip B. de Noble.
