Upon their return to the US in 1962, they decided to settle in Santa Barbara, then a quiet little city they had discovered on one of their weekend road trips down the California coast. Archie enrolled in UCSB, graduated and received his teaching credential. He immediately started working at the Santa Barbara Junior High School, then at the Santa Barbara High School, teaching French until he retired in 1996 ("Mr. Piach").

Archie and Colette settled on Samarkand Drive in Santa Barbara, where they raised their 8 children, Philippe (Suzan), Christine, Theresa (David), Paul (Victoria), Ian (Holly), Marina (Richard), Evan (Kathryn) and Erick (Jenn). Their home was, and still is, the center of family gatherings and wonderful Sunday dinners.

Since his retirement, Archie has enjoyed his time with his family and dear friends, writing short stories, finding treasures at back yard sales or swap meets, walking with the dogs (he considered family members), enjoying good food and old movies and taking occasional trips to Sacramento and Oregon.

His friends and family will remember him because of the many stories he told, his adventurous and sometimes rebellious side, his generosity and his warmth in making everyone welcome to his home.

He is survived by his wife and children with the exception of Christine who passed away in 2003, she had a very special place in his heart as a child born with severe disabilities.
