Barbara Jean Olsen, aged 87, entered Heaven peacefully on November 6, 2018 at home in Santa Barbara, CA. Her beloved children were by her side. Barbara was born November 18, 1930, in Aransas Pass, Texas the daughter of Curlie and Marie Terry.

Barbara was raised in Aransas Pass, Texas. She was the oldest of five siblings, Betty, Shirley, Carlotta and Curlie. After she graduated high school she was employed by a local insurance company. When her parents' earthly departure came all too early, she was partially responsible for raising and caring for the two youngest in her family, Carlotta and Curlie. From an early age, Barbara was bright, responsible, and dedicated to the well-being of others.

Barbara married the love of her life, Phil G. Olsen in Corpus Christi, Texas after meeting him in a local Spanish class. It gave Barbara immense pleasure to support and encourage those she loved. Additionally, Barbara had a great appreciation for the outdoors and enjoyed camping, backpacking, hiking, birdwatching and wild flowers. Barbara also loved to travel and took many trips to spend time with loved ones in Utah, Texas, Oklahoma, New Zealand, Europe and Mexico. Barbara kept her mind sharp and educated with her love of books and she read everything and anything. Her most treasured time was spent laughing and chatting with her children, grandchildren, family and friends.

Barbara will be remembered for many things but most of all for being a virtuous woman.
