Frieda, 93, of Montecito peacefully passed away on Wednesday, February 29, 2012. Born in Ihringshausen, Germany on July 15, 1918, Frieda came to the U.S. in 1924. She grew up in Chicago, Illinois, attending Lakeview High School and the Chicago Art Institute.

Moving to Santa Barbara in 1962, Frieda's career spanned many avenues including: executive secretary, fine apparel associate and buyer, wedding consultant and concierge. Her love of art included: Tole, sculpting, painting, glass blowing and piano. She was an active member of the National Society of Tole, Historical Society of America, and the local art community.

Frieda was preceded in death (1991) by her husband of 49 years, James F. Daley, and her brother Arthur W. Briede (2010).
