



## Mr. Juan Valeriano

June 25, 1936 - August 1, 2013

Juan Valeriano perdió su vida después de una larga batalla con el cáncer de pulmón a los 77 años el primero de agosto 2013 en el Hospital Cottage de Santa Barbara. Era un buen hombre que trabajó duro para ayudar a su familia cumplir todas las oportunidades disponible a ellos en este país. Fue muy bueno para hacer reír a todos y para dar buen consejo a todos los que quieran escuchar. Era muy conocido en la comunidad local, como alguien que siempre paraba a hablar con un vecino con una sonrisa. Nació el 25 de Junio de 1936 en Jalisco, Mexico. Pasó gran parte de su vida criando a su familia en Santa Barbara, California. Él se murió antes que su hijo, Juan Valeriano, Jr por cuatro años, una tragedia inesperada que cambió para siempre la vida de todos los miembros de su familia. Les sobreviven su esposa, Olivia, su hija, cuatro hijos y una familia muy grande que va a extrañarlo bien mucho. He was great at making everyone laugh and would give great advice to all who would listen. He was well known in the local community, as someone that would give a friendly smile along his morning walks and would always find time to stop and chat with neighbors and friends. He was born on June 25, 1936 in Jalisco Mexico. He spent much of his life raising his family in Santa Barbara, California. He is predeceased by his son, Juan Valeriano, Jr. by four years; an unexpected tragedy that forever changed the lives of everyone in his family. He is survived by his spouse, Olivia, his daughter, four sons and a very large extended family that will miss him greatly.
