On December 16, 2011, longtime Santa Barbara resident Nancy Yaqub passed away after a short illness.

Nancy taught Spanish for 22 years at UCSB. She then pursued a legal career, serving at two Santa Barbara law firms, and as a research attorney for the appellate court in Ventura.

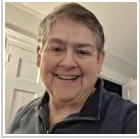
