January 17, 1927 - May 23, 2014

Our beloved mother and grandmother Tomoe “Tommy” Moyle passed away peacefully at home in Santa Barbara on Friday morning, May 23, 2014 where she lived with her daughter and son-in-law since 2012. She was born January 17, 1927 in Monterey, California to Koichi Tanaka and Yae (Sumida) Tanaka and was the youngest of five siblings. During WWII her family was in the Poston Internment Camp III (Arizona) where she graduated high school. After the war, she returned to Monterey with her family where she worked as a bookkeeper for an accounting firm.

She moved to southern California and worked as a bookkeeper in Oxnard. There she met her husband John Edward Moyle and they were married in 1954. He worked for Raytheon by day and was a Dixieland jazz musician by night. She was a caring and encouraging wife and mother; an example of tireless devotion. They were happily married 40 years before he preceded her in death in 1994.

She is survived by her brothers George Tanaka (& wife Jean in Pacific Grove) and Frank (& wife Kaye in Monterey). Tommy’s 3 children are: Janelle Pearson (Simi Valley); Dorothy with husband Dana Alexander (Santa Barbara); and Dale with wife Norene Moyle (Buckeye, AZ). She is survived by 9 grandchildren – Michael, Rebekah, John, Daniel, Bethany, Sharon Joy, Jonathan, Lindsey, and Emily. She also has 8 great-grandchildren – Dominic, Ethan, Caleb, Andrew, Preston, Hannah, Maddox, and Tamoy.

She was baptized at St. Athanasius Antiochian Orthodox Church in 2013 and

had a funeral service there on May 24, 2014.
